

## RoHS Policy

The new RoHS Directive 2011/65/EU (RoHS 2) entered into force on 21 July 2011. It covers "the restriction of the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment".

RoHS bans the introduction of new electrical and electronic equipment to the EU market containing higher than agreed levels of such hazardous substances.

The hazardous substances and their maximum allowed concentrations as defined under RoHS are listed below:


- **Lead (Pb):** < 1000 ppm
- **Mercury (Hg):** < 100 ppm
- **Cadmium (Cd):** < 100 ppm
- **Hexavalent Chromium: (Cr VI)** < 1000 ppm
- **Polybrominated Biphenyls (PBB):** < 1000 ppm
- **Polybrominated Diphenyl Ethers (PBDE):** < 1000 ppm
- **Bis(2-Ethylhexyl) phthalate (DEHP):** < 1000 ppm
- **Benzyl butyl phthalate (BBP):** < 1000 ppm
- **Dibutyl phthalate (DBP):** < 1000 ppm
- **Diisobutyl phthalate (DIBP):** < 1000 ppm

There are several exemptions for the use of such hazardous substances for specific technical applications where alternatives do not currently exist.
